Subject: Expressing Disappointment in the Handling of a Sexual Harassment Case

Dear Members of the Whatcom County Council,

We, the undersigned employees of Whatcom County, are writing to express our deep disappointment and concern regarding the recent handling of a sexual harassment case within our organization. We bring this matter to your attention because we firmly believe in the necessity of maintaining a safe and inclusive work environment for all employees.

As employees, we expect that our concerns regarding sexual harassment will be treated with the utmost gravity, subject to thorough and expeditious investigation, and actions will be taken to rectify the issue. However, in this particular case, we feel that our trust in the process has been compromised and the victims did not receive the support and justice they deserved. Moreover, the accused was recommended for employment elsewhere in a similar position of power, posing a potential risk of recurrence. This constitutes a failure on the part of our organization. The actions taken by the administration have had far-reaching consequences, impacting both our organization and the broader community.

The mishandling of this case has eroded the trust and confidence we have in the County Administration's commitment to addressing sexual harassment cases effectively. We do not feel safe or supported. It is disheartening to witness a lack of accountability and transparency, which are essential in creating a workplace free from harassment, discrimination and bullying.

We applaud the County Council's vote to conduct an independent investigation into the incident and we urge you to ensure that appropriate measures are implemented to prevent such incidents from occurring in the future. Specifically, we request:

- 1. Reaffirmation of the County commitment to ensuring employees are provided with a safe and inclusive work environment, with clear and robust policies against sexual harassment and a zero-tolerance approach.
- 2. Implementation of a transparent process for creating and maintaining policies and procedures, such as an annual independent review by a third party, gathering feedback from stakeholders, and incorporating and addressing employees' suggestions, concerns and questions.
- 3. Increased HR support with expanded and ongoing training and resources to educate employees, supervisors, and high-level leadership on preventing and addressing sexual harassment effectively.
- 4. Regular communication and updates on the progress made in addressing this issue, to regain our trust and confidence in the County's commitment to its employees.

We believe that by addressing these concerns promptly and transparently, the County Administration can demonstrate its commitment to the well-being of Whatcom County employees and work towards creating an environment where everyone feels safe, respected, and valued.

We kindly request a timely response to this letter outlining the actions that will be taken to address our concerns. We look forward to a resolution that upholds the principles of fairness, equality, and justice.
